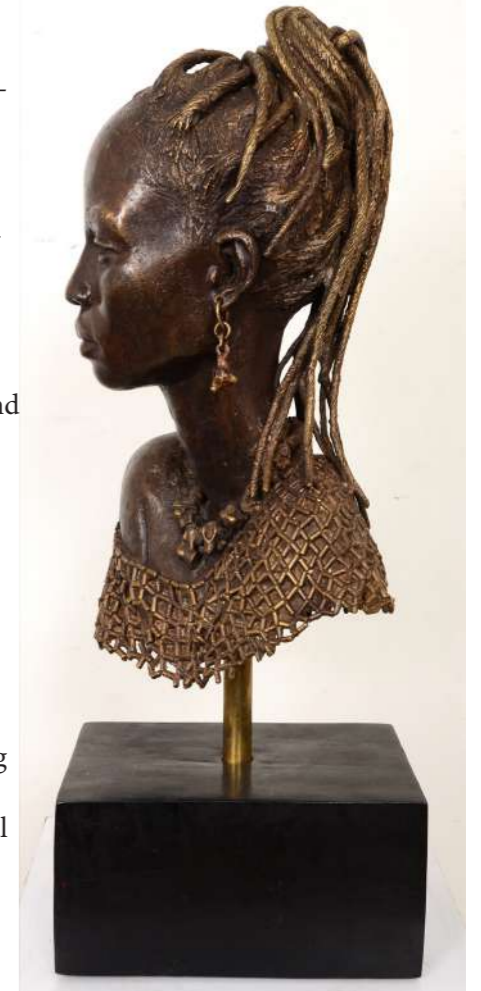

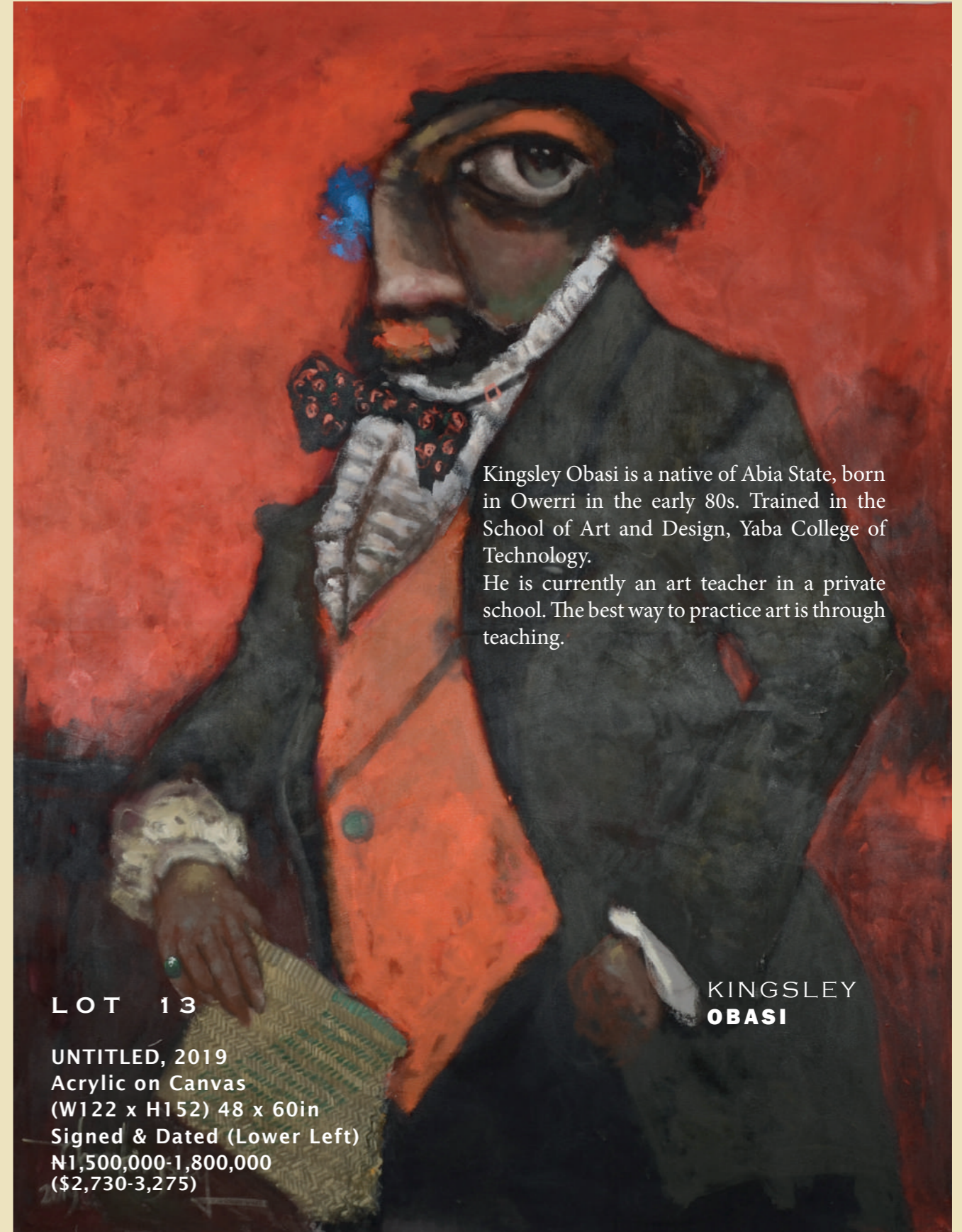

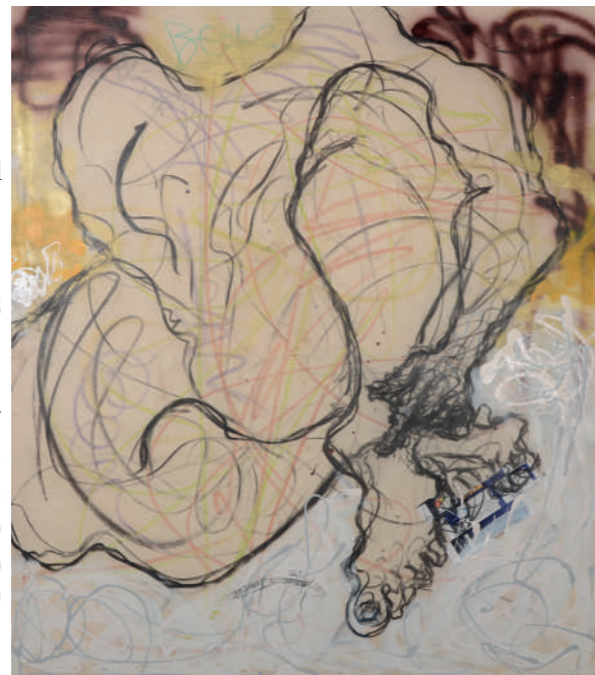
Struggle; a sign of life.

He uses acrylic, paper, and charcoal on canvas as mediums of expression to discuss his experience and activities around him while growing up.

Cultural understanding is easier for children when it is grounded in commonalities. By learning and playing games that children in different cultures also play, kids can come to discover that people from different parts of the world are not as different as they might think.

Ayo-ayo (or just Ayo), is a traditional game played by the Yoruba people of Nigeria. It is a game that requires a lot of brainpower and mathematical skill. This is played on a rectangular carved hole by two players with 12 round pits, 6 on each side. 48 small seeds are shared in fours into each of the 12 holes. Each player takes turns to move seeds from the pits on his side of the hole and strives to win more than half the seeds to win the game.

Ayo means seeds.

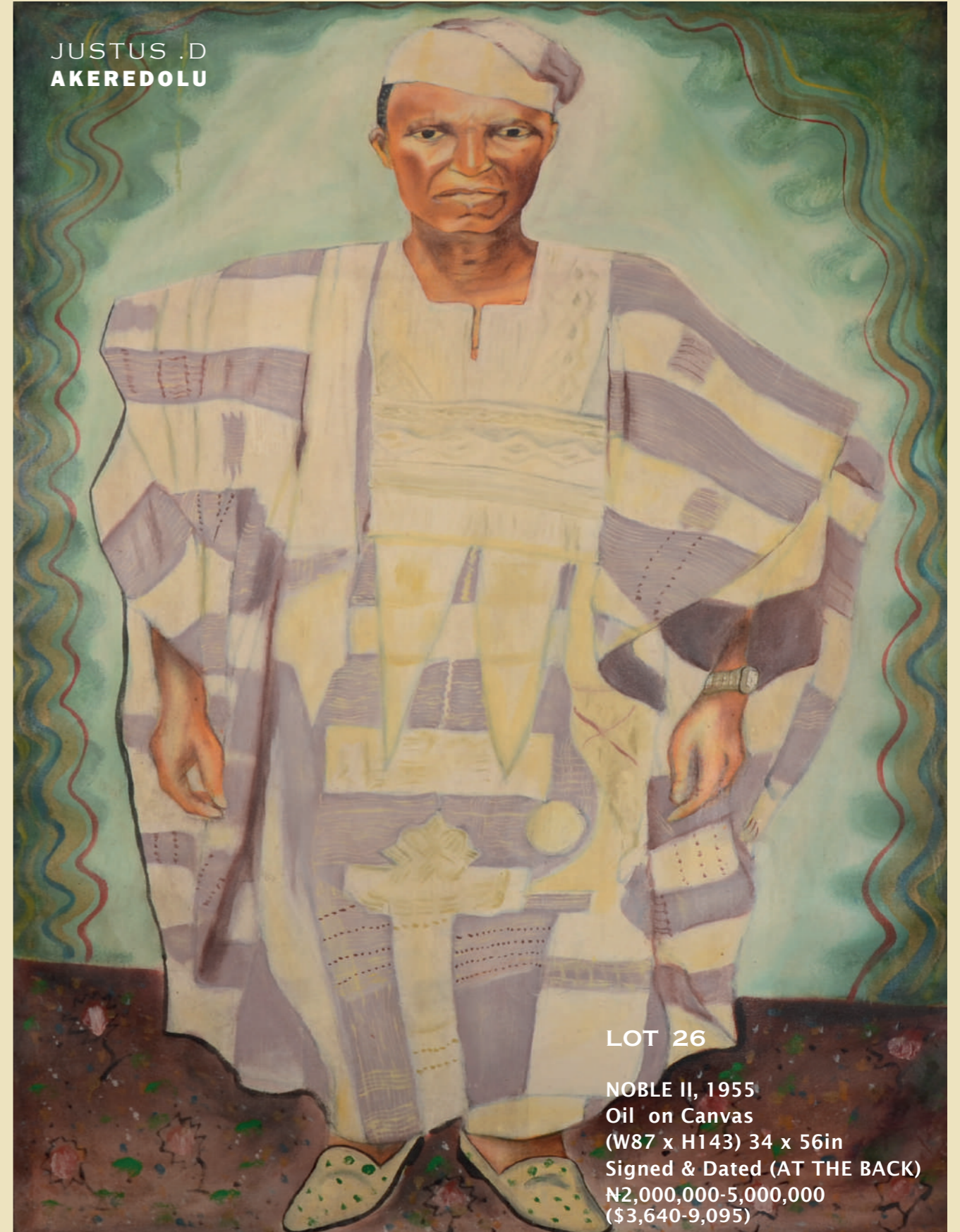

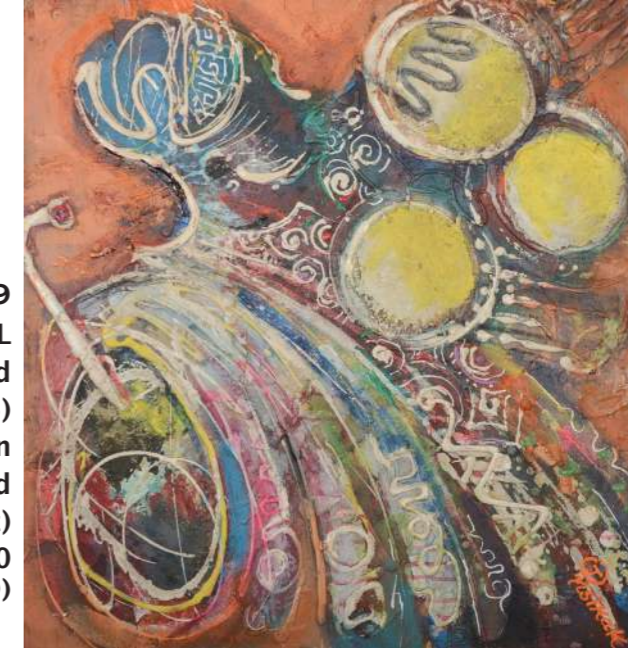

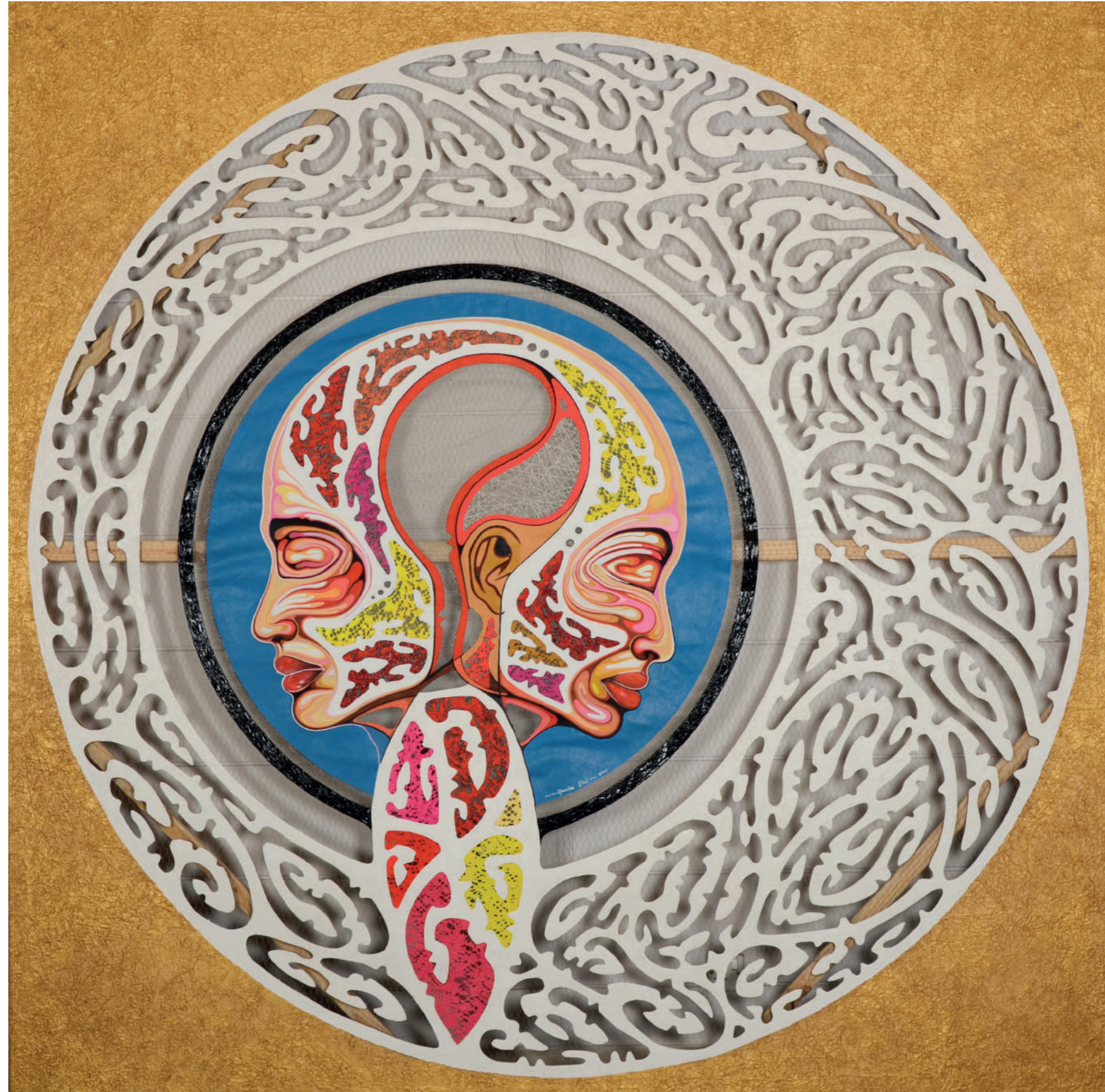

Promise Onali (b. 1982) studied fine art at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where he graduated with a degree in painting in 2007. His love for comic books and science, as well as his preoccupation with figuring out the inner workings of things, influenced his experimental painting style. Onali's use of diverse media to explore scientific questions is grounded in strong linearity and embryonic metaphors. His fascination with how our nerve endings disperse energy and electric charges which give birth to ideas and thought are reflected in the subtle layers of his mixed-media works.

Onali's mixed media works pull the observer into a world of linear complexity comprised of careful rendition of lines and swirls that evoke a certain sense of ambiguity. Bidding
