The sketch architecture series are influenced by the works of African architects like El Whakil, It is a merge of the old and new, driven by the effect of climate change on sustainability and resilient cities in the world.

Sketch architecture series 005 shows forms and shapes created from solids and line with balconies and roofs with passage ways and motifs creating a black and white collage highlighted with blues, browns and silvers.

The lines send prolific compositions driven by energy and freedom.

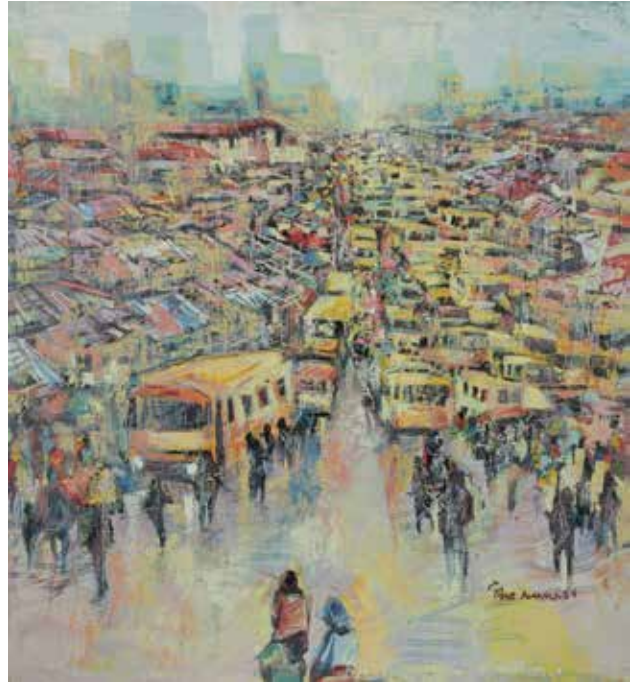

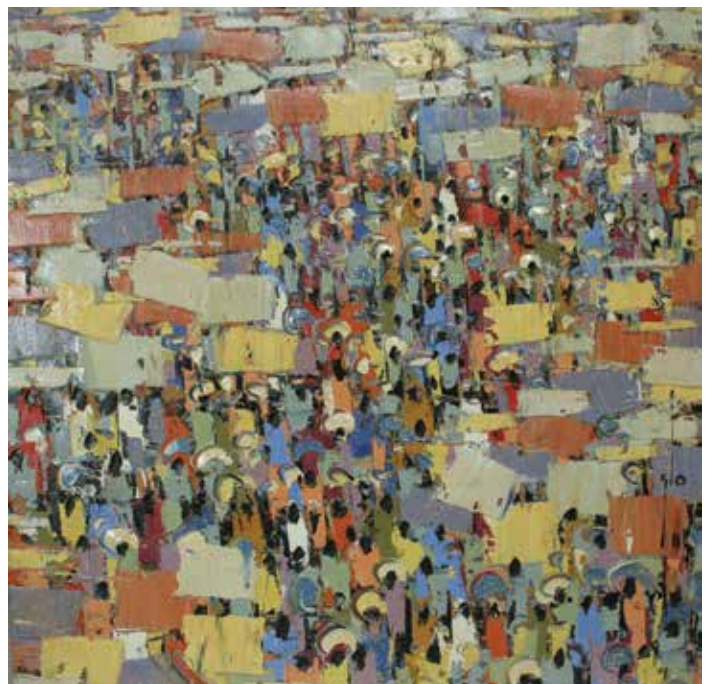


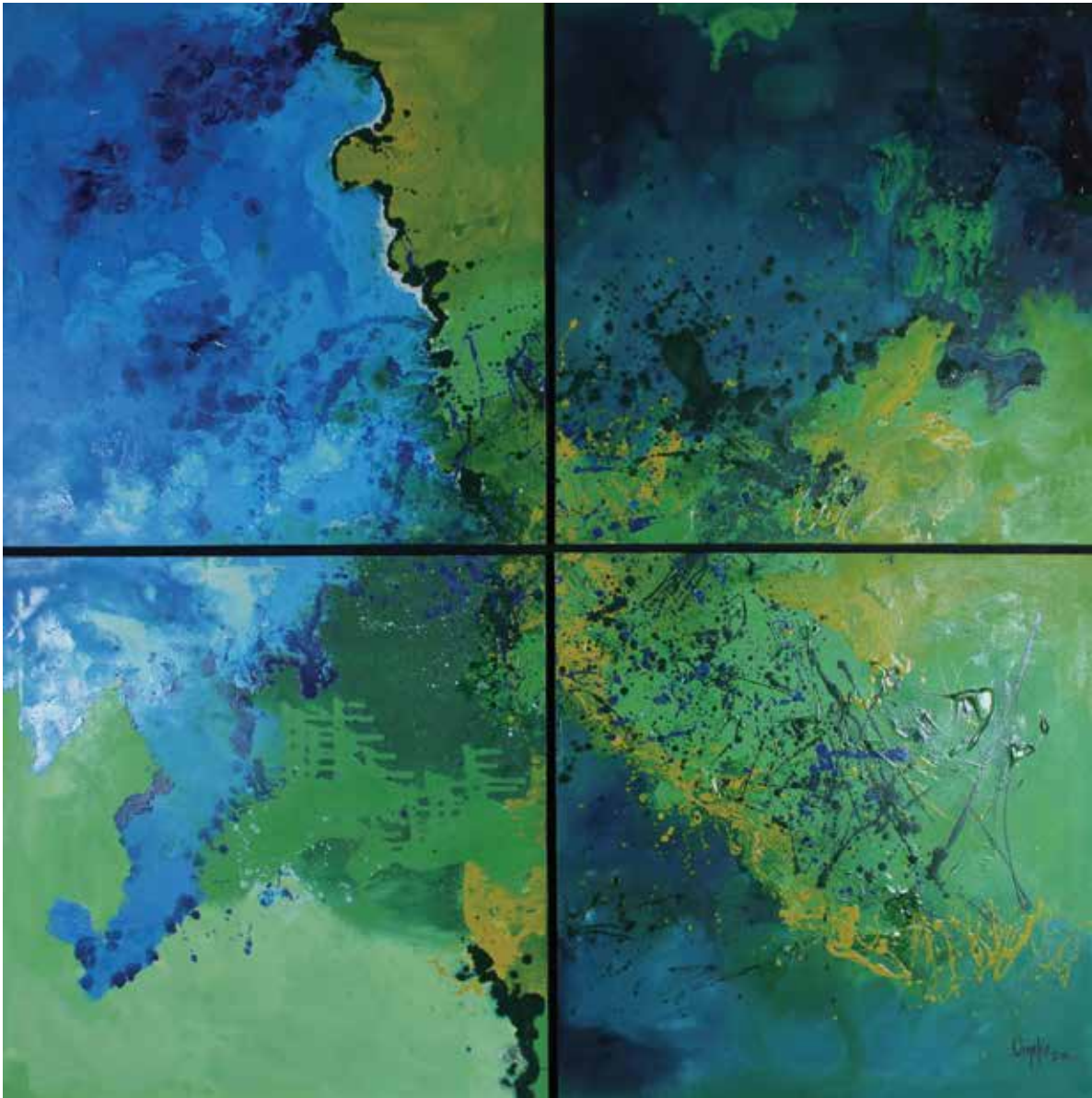

Afropolitan Series explores different ideas of portraiture in African and Western art practices, in expressing the cosmopolitan nature of Africans. Achille Mbembe in his essay "Afropolitanism" notes that Africa's "way of belonging to the world, of being in the world and inhabiting it, has always been marked by, if not cultural mixing, then at least the interweaving of worlds." Elements of postcards have been explored to invoke the colonial practice of using postcards in the dissemination of photographic images of Africans in the West.

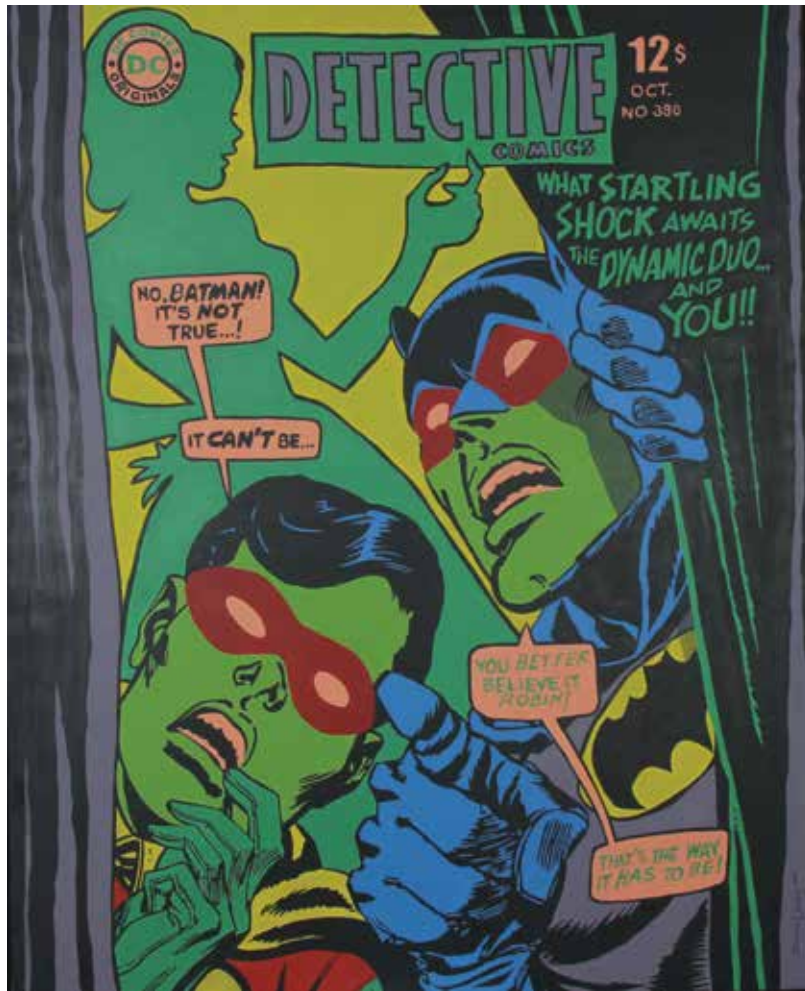

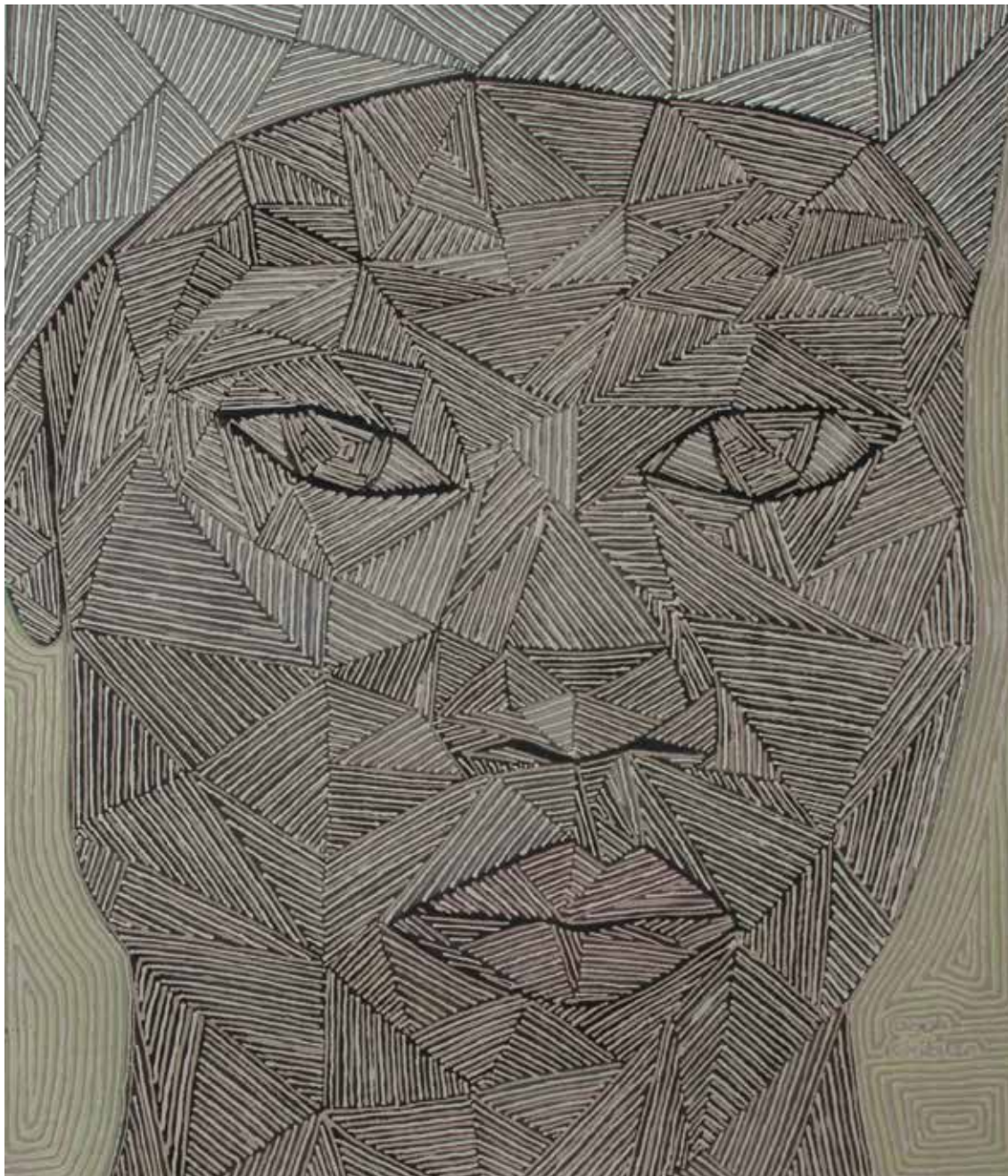

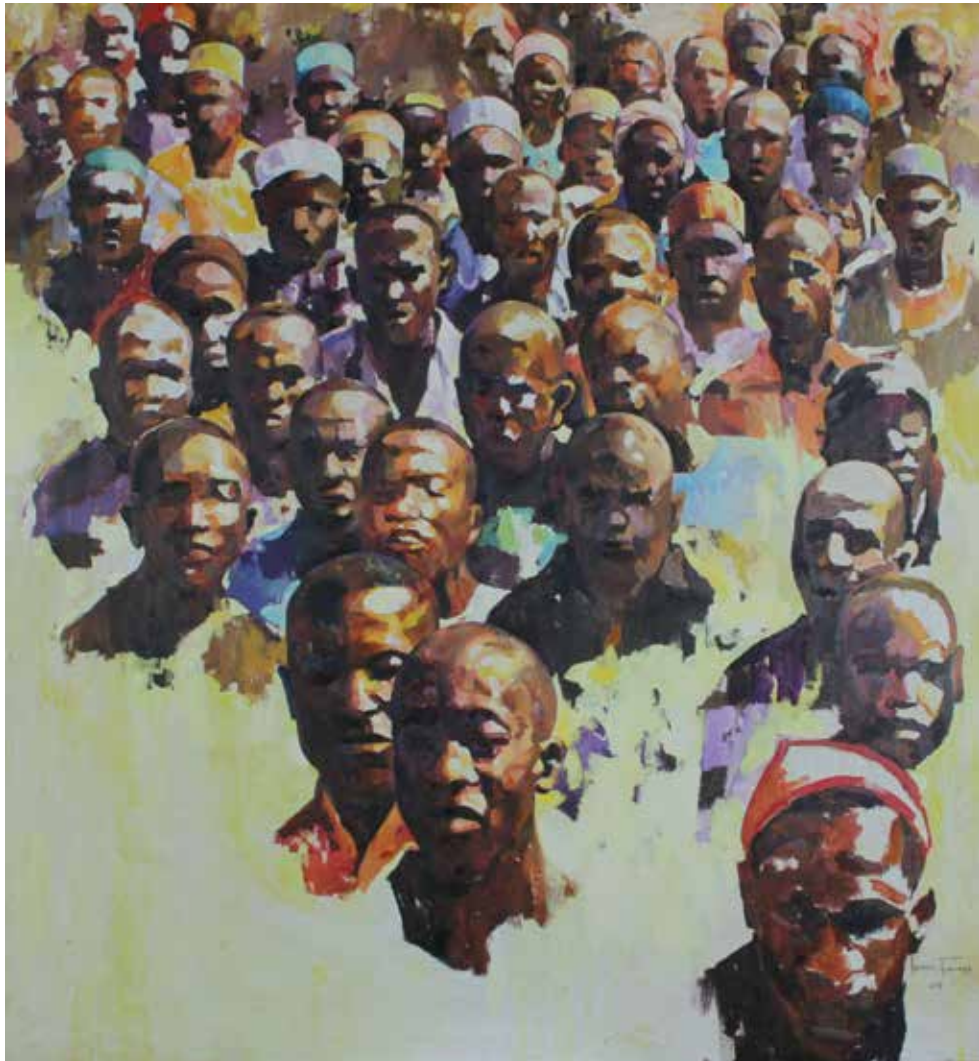

The reserve, either by placing consecutive bids or by entering bids in response

To those made in the saleroom and/or absentee bids. After the reserve is met,

The auctioneer will not execute any further bids.

ABSENTEE BIDS

A registered prospective buyer that is unable to attend the auction can complete a written instruction in the form of an absentee bid. This would be a maximum amount the bidder is willing to declare as the hammer price.

Sogal Art Auction will attempt to execute an absentee bid at the lowest possible price taking into account the reserve price. If identical bids are made for the same lot, the first bid received by Sogal will take priority. The auctioneer may execute absentee bids himself with a verbal declaration that he is doing so. ESTIMATES

taining licenses shall neither justify the rescission of any sale nor any delay in making full payment for the lot. BEFORE THE SALE

4. (a) A prospective buyer must complete and sign a bidder registration form and provide identification before he has the Right to bid. 15. If the buyer fails to make payment in full in good cleared funds within the time required by paragraph 11 above, we shall be entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following Rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other Rights or remedies available to us by law):

- (a) to charge interest at such rate we shall reasonably decide;
- (b) to hold the defaulting buyer liable for the

total amount due and to commence legal proceeding for its recovery together with interest, legal fees and cost to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law;

(c) to cancel the sale

(d) to resell the property publicly or privately on such terms as we shall think fit

(e) to reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the buyer or to obtain a deposit from the buyer before accepting any bids;

(f) to take such other action as we deem necessary or appropriate.

This includes payment of all other amounts due to Sogal Art Auction, in respect of the purchase price and any applicable taxes.
